COAST GUARD RADIO OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE SPECIALIZATION BADGE

1. REFERENCE

HPCG Circular Nr. 06-10, entitled "PCG Awards and Decorations" dated 24 May 2010.

2. PURPOSE

This Circular prescribes the eligibility, authority and policies governing the award of Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Badge.

3. OBJECTIVES

A. To give identification to PCG Non-Officers who had completed the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Course (ROMSC) facilitated by the Coast Guard Weapons, Communications, Electronics and Information System Command (CGWCEISC) through its Training Institute.

B. To provide policies, guidance and procedures in conferring the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Badge.

SCOPE

This Circular applies to all PCG Non-Officers who completed the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Course.





5. THE RADIO OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE SPECIALIZATION BADGE

A. Description

The design of Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Badge represents the following traditional and typical elements of Coast Guard service:

- i. **Gear/Wrench** Symbolizes the hands-on role of the Radio Operator in maintaining and repairing communication equipment afloat and ashore. It highlights the critical responsibility of ensuring all systems are operational, contributing to the overall effectiveness of PCG communication to ensure operational effectiveness.
- ii. **Communications Tower -** Symbolizes seamless connectivity, representing the crucial role of a Radio Operator in transmitting and receiving signals over long distances to maintain reliable communication systems within the PCG.
- iii. **Lightning** Represents the electrical power essential for operating radio equipment, highlighting the importance of signal strength in maintaining effective communication. It emphasizes the Radio Operator's role in ensuring operational and dependable communication networks.
- iv. Radar Signifies the Radio Operator's capability to detect, track and monitor communication signals and objects over extensive distances. It embodies vigilance, surveillance and precise monitoring, which are important for maintaining situational awareness and achieving mission success within the PCG.
- v. **Radio** Represents the foundation of real-time communication and coordination. It underscores the Radio Operator's vital role in maintaining operational effectiveness and supporting mission accomplishment through timely and reliable information exchange.

B. To Whom Awarded

PCG Non-Officers who satisfactorily graduated the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Course.

C. By Whom Awarded

Commander, Coast Guard Weapons, Communication, Electronics and Information Systems Command during the graduation ceremony of the said course.






D. Requirements / Qualifications for the Award

- PCG Non-Officers who had completed the ROMSC.
- Approval of Commander, CGWCEISC upon the recommendation of the Commanding Officer, CGWCEIS Training Institute.

6. POLICY GUIDELINES

- A. Commander, CGWCEISC, upon recommendation of the Commanding Officer, CGWCEIS Training Institute, has the authority to approve and grant the Badge to the PCG Non-Officers who completed the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Course.
- B. The granting of wearing the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Badge shall be covered and published through appropriate orders issued by the Admin Branch, CGWCEIS Training Institute and Adjutant, CGWCEISC.
- C. The Registrar, CGWCEIS Training Institute shall maintain a list of eligible personnel who met the qualifications for the conferment of the Badge as required herein.

MANNER OF WEARING

- A. The Badge shall be worn in an upright position on the uniform.
- B. The Badge shall be worn at the left center pocket of the uniform just below the flap of the left pocket. The Badge must be seen and recognizable as the specialization of the wearer.





C. The Badge shall be worn in all uniforms authorized by the Philippine Coast Guard except Battle Dress Attire which have a corresponding cloth Patch, which shall be worn in replacement of the Badge.

8. TRANSITORY PROVISIONS

PCG Non-Officers who had completed the Coast Guard Radio Operations and Maintenance Specialization Course are the only personnel authorized to wear the badge.

9. RESCISSION

All publications inconsistent with this Circular are hereby modified or rescinded upon approval and effectivity of this Circular.

10. EFFECTIVITY

This Circular shall be implemented effective 20 March 2025.
